GROTON SCHOOL DISTRICT 6-3 BOND RESOLUTION:

Commissioner Sutton offered the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 08-09

Resolution authorizing the execution, terms, issuance, sale and payment of Groton School District 6-3 General Obligation Refunding Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Two Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,300,000) of the Groton School District 6-3 of Brown County, South Dakota.

WHEREAS, the Brown County is acting as the governing body of the dissolved School District of Groton School District 6-3 (the "School District") because of a reorganization pursuant to SDCL §13-6-82.

WHEREAS, the Brown County is authorized by the provisions of SDCL §§ 6-8B-30 though 6-8B-52 and 13-6-59 to issue General Obligation Refunding Bonds to refund and refinance validly issued outstanding General Obligation Bonds, Series 2002 of the School District (the "Refunded Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the County Commission has determined that refunding certain General Obligation Bonds of the dissolved School District will reduce the interest expense to the taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has determined that is necessary and in the best interest of the taxpayers to issue General Obligation Refunding Bonds for the purpose of providing funds to (i) refinance all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds, as such term is defined herein; and (ii) pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF BROWN COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

Section 1.1. Definition of Terms.

In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Bond Resolution, the following words and terms as used herein, whether or not the words have initial capitals, shall have the following meanings, unless the context or use indicates another or different meaning or intent, and such definitions shall be equally applicable to both the singular and plural forms of any of the words and terms herein defined:

"Act" means collectively SDCL Chapter 6-8B and Title 13, as amended.

"Auditor" means the Auditor of the County elected pursuant to the provisions of South Dakota Codified Laws Title 7-10 or, in the absence of such appointment or in the event the person so appointed is unable or incapable of acting in such capacity, the person appointed by the Auditor to perform the duties otherwise performed by the Auditor, or his designee.

"<u>Authorized Officer of the County</u>" means the Chairman and the Auditor, or, in the case of any act to be performed or duty to be discharged, any other member, officer, or employee of the County then authorized to perform such act or discharge such duty.

"Bond Counsel" means Meierhenry Sargent LLP, a firm of attorneys recognized as having experience in matters relating to the issuance of state or local governmental obligations.

"Bond Payment Date" " means each date on which interest, or both principal and interest, shall be payable on the Bonds so long as any of the Bonds shall be outstanding.

"Bond Purchase Agreement" means the agreement between the County Commission and the Underwriter for the purchase of the Bonds.

"Bond Resolution" means this Resolution, as it may be amended from time to time.

"Bondholder", "Holder" and "Registered Owner" means the registered owner of a Bond, including any nominee of a Depository.

"Bonds" means not to exceed \$2,300,000 in aggregate principal amount of General Obligation Refunding Bonds (Groton School District 6-3), Series 2009, dated the date of issuance, or such other designation or date as shall be determined by the School Board pursuant to Section 8.1 hereof, authorized and issued under the Bond Resolution.

"Book-Entry Form" or "Book-Entry System" means a form or system, as applicable, under which physical Bond certificates in fully registered form are issued to a Depository or to its nominee as Registered Owner, with the certificated Bonds being held by and "immobilized" in the custody of such Depository, and under which records maintained by persons, other than the County Commission or the Registration Agent, constitute the written record that identifies, and records the transfer of the beneficial "book-entry" interests in those Bonds.

"Chairman" means the Chairman elected pursuant to the provisions of SDCL 13-8 or his or her designee acting on his or her behalf pursuant to the Charter.

"County" means Brown County, South Dakota.

"Closing Date" means the date the Bonds are exchanged for value.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the applicable regulations of the United States Department of Treasury promulgated thereunder as in effect on the date of issuance of the Bonds.

"Depository" means any securities depository that is a clearing agency under federal laws operating and maintaining, with its participants or otherwise, a Book-Entry System, including, but not limited to DTC.

"<u>DTC Participant(s)</u>" means securities brokers and dealers, banks, trust companies and clearing corporations that have access to the DTC system.

"<u>DTC</u>" means the Depository Trust Company, a limited purpose company organized under the laws of the State of New York, and its successors and assigns.

"Groton School District 6-3" means the Groton School District 6-3, Brown County, South Dakota.

"Interest Payment Dates" means each date on which interest shall be payable on the Bonds so long as any of the Bonds shall be outstanding.

"<u>Letter of Representation</u>" means the Issuer Letter of Representations or Blanket Issuer Letter of Representations to DTC of the County.

"Official Statement" and "Preliminary Official Statement" means that Official Statement and Preliminary Official Statement described in Section 8.2 hereof pertaining to the sale of the Bonds.

"Original Issue Discount or O.I.D." means the difference between the issue price and the stated redemption price at maturity. The stated redemption price is determined without regard to optional call dates.

"Outstanding," "Bonds Outstanding," or "Outstanding Bonds" means, as of a particular date all Bonds issued and delivered under this Bond Resolution except: (1) any Bond paid or redeemed or otherwise canceled by the County at or before such date; (2) any Bond for the payment of which cash, equal to the principal amount thereof with interest to date of maturity, shall have theretofore been deposited prior to maturity by the County for the benefit of the Owner thereof; (3) any Bond for the redemption of which cash, equal to the redemption price thereof with interest to the redemption date, shall have theretofore been deposited with the Registration Agent and for which notice of redemption shall have been mailed in accordance with this Bond Resolution; (4) any Bond in lieu of or in substitution for which another Bond shall have been delivered pursuant to this Resolution, unless proof satisfactory to the County is presented that any Bond, for which a Bond in lieu of or in substitution therefore shall have been delivered, is held by a bona fide purchaser, as that term is defined in Article 8 of the Uniform Commercial Code of the State, as amended, in which case both the Bond in lieu of or in substitution for which a new Bond has been delivered and such new Bond so delivered therefore shall be deemed Outstanding; and, (5) any Bond deemed paid under the provisions of Article VII of this Resolution, except that any such Bond shall be considered Outstanding until the maturity or redemption date thereof only for the purposes of being exchanged, transferred, or registered.

"Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation, trust, or unincorporated organization, or a governmental entity or agency or political subdivision thereof.



"<u>Purchase Agreement</u>" means the Bond Purchase Agreement authorized pursuant to and described in Section 8.1 hereof by and between the County and the Underwriter.

"Rating Agency" means Moody's Investor Services, Standard and Poor's or Fitch Ratings Service.

"Record Date" means such dates as set forth in the Certificate Purchase Agreement..

"Refunded Bonds" means the \$2,700,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2002 Bonds dated July 1, 2002.

"Registration Agent" means the Registration Agent appointed by the Auditor its successor or successors hereafter appointed in the manner provided in Article VI hereof.

"Resolution" means this Bond Resolution.

"Schedule" the schedule which indicates the principal and interest payments on the Bonds.

"School District" means the dissolved Groton School District 6-3.

"Series 2002 Bonds" means the School District's outstanding General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2002, dated July 1, 2002, to be redeemed on such date set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, as follows:

Section 1.2. References to Resolution.

The words "hereof", "herein", "hereunder", and other words of similar import refer to this Bond Resolution as a whole.

Section 1.3. References to Articles, Sections, Etc.

[&]quot;<u>Underwriter</u>" means Northland Securities, Inc., acting for and on behalf of itself and such securities dealers as it may designate.

[&]quot;Vice-Chairman" means the Vice-Chairman who may act for the Chairman in the absence of the Chairman.

References to Articles, Sections, and other subdivisions of this Bond Resolution are to the designated Articles, Sections, and other subdivisions of this Bond Resolution as originally adopted.

Section 1.4. Headings.

The headings of this Bond Resolution are for convenience only and shall not define or limit the provisions hereof.

ARTICLE II FINDINGS

Section 2.1.

It is hereby found and determined by the County Commission as follows:

- (a) The refunding of the Refunded Bonds as set forth herein through the issuance of the Bonds will result in the reduction in debt service payable by the County over the term of the Refunded Bonds thereby effecting a cost savings to the public;
- (b) The County hereby determines that all limitations upon the issuance of Bonds have been met and the Bonds are being authorized, issued and sold in accordance with the provisions of §§ 6-8B-30 to 6-8B-52, inclusive.

ARTICLE III AUTHORITY, PLEDGE, AND LEVY

Section 3.1. Authority.

In order to (i) refund the Refunded Bonds and (ii) pay costs incident to the sale and issuance of the Bonds, there shall be issued pursuant to, and in accordance with, the provisions of the Act, the Bond Resolution, and other applicable provisions of law, General Obligation Refunding Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$2,300,000.

Section 3.2. Pledge.

The taxing powers of SDCL 13-6-82 shall be and they are hereby irrevocably pledged to the prompt and full payment of the principal of and interest on each and all of said Bonds as such principal and interest respectively become due. Pursuant to SDCL § 13-16-82, the County does hereby pledge and provide for an annual tax sufficient to pay principal and interest on the Bonds when due. All taxes in counties in which the School District previously existed shall be pledged for the payment of principal and interest respectively become due.

Section 3.3. Levy of Taxes.

The County does hereby provide for an annual levy to produce collected taxes, taking into consideration an amount necessary to provide for delinquencies, reasonable reserve and mandatory early redemption, to pay principal and interest on the Bonds when due. The Schedule is made a part this resolution as if stated in full and shall be open to public inspection at the office of the Auditor. Said levies shall be irrepealable so long as any of the Bonds of said issue or interest thereon shall remain unpaid, except that the County Commission of the County and the Auditor shall have the power to reduce the levy as provided by SDCL §13-16-11.

ARTICLE IV

FORM, TERMS, EXECUTION, AND TRANSFER OF BONDS



Section 4.1. Authorized Bonds.

The aggregate principal amount of Bonds that may be issued under the Bond Resolution shall not exceed Two Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,300,000).

Section 4.2. Form of Bonds; Execution.

- (a) The Bonds are issuable only as fully registered Bonds, without coupons, in the denomination of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or any integral multiple thereof (but no single Certificate shall represent installments of principal maturing on more than one date). All Bonds issued under the Resolution shall be substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto, and by this reference incorporated herein as fully as though copied.
- (b) The Bonds shall be executed in such manner as may be prescribed by applicable law in the name and on behalf of the County with the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman, attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Auditor, and approved as to form and countersigned by a Resident Attorney by his manual or facsimile signature.
- (c) In the event any officer whose manual or facsimile signature shall appear on any Bond shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Bond, such manual or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes as if he or she had remained in office until such delivery. Any Bond may bear the facsimile signature of, or may be manually signed by, such individuals who, at the actual time of the execution of such Bond, were the proper officers of the County to sign such Bond, although on the date of the adoption by the County of this Resolution, such individuals may not have been such officers.

Section 4.3. Maturities, Interest Rates, and Certain Other Provisions of Bonds.

- (a) The Bonds shall become due and payable and be subject to the terms and conditions as are set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement.
- (b) The Bonds shall be designated "General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2009", or such other designation as shall be determined by the School Board pursuant to Section 8.1 hereof. The Bonds shall bear interest from their date or from the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, until the principal amount of the Bond is paid, such interest (computed upon the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months) being payable on Interest payment Dates. Interest on each Bond shall be paid by wire transfer, check or draft of the Paying Agent, payable in lawful money of the United States of America, to the person in whose name such Bond is registered at the close of business on the Record Date. The principal of the Bond shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the principal office of the Paying Agent on the Bond Payment Date. Each Certificate shall state that it is issued pursuant to SDCL 6-8B.
- (c) The Registration Agent shall make all interest payments with respect to the Bonds on each interest payment date directly to the registered owners as shown on the Bond registration records maintained by the Registration Agent as of the close of business on the Record Date by wire transfer, check or draft mailed to such owners at their addresses shown on said Bond registration records, without, except for final payment, the presentation or surrender of such registered Bonds, and all such payments shall discharge the obligations of the County in respect of such Bonds to the extent of the payments so made. Payment of principal of and premium, if any, on the Bonds shall be made upon presentation and surrender of such Bonds to the Registration Agent as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 4.4. Negotiability of Bonds.

All Bonds issued under this Resolution shall be negotiable, subject to the provisions for registration and transfer contained in this Resolution and in the Bonds.

Section 4.5. Registration, Transfer and Exchange of Bonds.

- The Bonds are transferable only by presentation to the Registration Agent by the registered owner, or his legal representative duly authorized in writing, of the registered Bond(s) to be transferred with the form of assignment on the reverse side thereof completed in full and signed with the name of the registered owner as it appears upon the face of the Bond(s) accompanied by appropriate documentation necessary to prove the legal capacity of any legal representative of the registered owner. Upon receipt of the Bond(s) in such form and with such documentation, if any, the Registration Agent shall issue a new Bond or Bonds to the assignee(s) in \$5,000 denominations, or integral multiples thereof, as requested by the registered owner requesting transfer. The Registration Agent shall not be required to transfer or exchange any Bond during the period commencing on a Record Date and ending on the corresponding interest payment date of such Bond, nor to transfer or exchange any Bond after the publication of notice calling such Bond for redemption has been made, nor to transfer or exchange any Bond during the period following the receipt of instructions from the County to call such Bond for redemption; provided, the Registration Agent, at its option, may make transfers after any of said dates. No charge shall be made to any registered owner for the privilege of transferring any Bond, provided that any transfer tax relating to such transaction shall be paid by the registered owner requesting transfer. The person in whose name any Bond shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes and neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary whether or not any payments due on the Bonds shall be overdue. Bonds, upon surrender to the Registration Agent, may, at the option of the registered owner, be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of Bonds of the same maturity in any authorized denomination or denominations.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Bonds shall be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, which will act as securities depository for the Bonds. References in this Section to a Bond or the Bonds shall be construed to mean the Bond or the Bonds that are held under the Book-Entry System. One Bond for each maturity shall be issued to DTC and immobilized in its custody. Unless otherwise provided herein, a Book-Entry System shall be employed, evidencing ownership of the Bonds in authorized denominations, with transfers of beneficial ownership affected on the records of DTC and the DTC Participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC.

Each DTC Participant shall be credited in the records of DTC with the amount of such DTC Participant's interest in the Bonds. Beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds may be purchased by or through DTC Participants. The holders of these beneficial ownership interests are herein referred to as the "Beneficial Owners." The Beneficial Owners shall not receive the Bonds representing their beneficial ownership interests. The ownership interests of each Beneficial Owner shall be recorded through the records of the DTC Participant from which such Beneficial Owner purchased its Bonds. Transfers of ownership interests in the Bonds shall be accomplished by book entries made by DTC and, in turn, by DTC Participants acting on behalf of Beneficial Owners. SO LONG AS CEDE & CO., AS NOMINEE FOR DTC, IS THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE BONDS, THE REGISTRATION AGENT SHALL TREAT CEDE & CO., AS THE ONLY HOLDER OF THE BONDS FOR ALL PURPOSES UNDER THIS RESOLUTION, INCLUDING RECEIPT OF ALL PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS, RECEIPT OF NOTICES, VOTING AND REQUESTING OR DIRECTING THE REGISTRATION AGENT TO TAKE OR NOT TO TAKE, OR CONSENTING TO, CERTAIN ACTIONS UNDER THIS BOND RESOLUTION.

Payments of principal, interest, and redemption premium, if any, with respect to the Bonds, so long as DTC is the only owner of the Bonds, shall be paid by the Registration Agent directly to DTC or its

nominee, Cede & Co., as provided in the Letter of Representation. DTC shall remit such payments to DTC Participants, and such payments thereafter shall be paid by DTC Participants to the Beneficial Owners. Neither the County nor the Registration Agent shall be responsible or liable for payment by DTC or DTC Participants, for sending transaction statements or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing records maintained by DTC or DTC Participants.

In the event that (1) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Bonds or (2) the County determines that the continuation of the Book-Entry System of evidence and transfer of ownership of the Bonds would adversely affect their interests or the interests of the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds, the County may discontinue the Book-Entry System with DTC. If the County fails to identify another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County shall cause the Registration Agent to authenticate and deliver replacement Bonds in the form of fully registered Bonds to each Beneficial Owner.

NEITHER THE COUNTY NOR THE REGISTRATION AGENT SHALL HAVE ANY RESPONSIBILITY OR OBLIGATIONS TO ANY DTC PARTICIPANT OR ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER WITH RESPECT TO (i) THE BONDS; (ii) THE ACCURACY OF ANY RECORDS MAINTAINED BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT; (iii) THE PAYMENT BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT OF ANY AMOUNT DUE TO ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER IN RESPECT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; (iv) THE DELIVERY OR TIMELINESS OF DELIVERY BY DTC OR ANY DTC PARTICIPANT OF ANY NOTICE DUE TO ANY BENEFICIAL OWNER THAT IS REQUIRED OR PERMITTED UNDER THE TERMS OF THIS BOND RESOLUTION TO BE GIVEN TO BENEFICIAL OWNERS, (v) THE SELECTION OF BENEFICIAL OWNERS TO RECEIVE PAYMENTS IN THE EVENT OF ANY PARTIAL REDEMPTION OF THE BONDS; OR (vi) ANY CONSENT GIVEN OR OTHER ACTION TAKEN BY DTC, OR ITS NOMINEE, CEDE & CO., AS OWNER.

SO LONG AS A BOOK-ENTRY SYSTEM OF EVIDENCE OF TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF ALL THE BONDS IS MAINTAINED IN ACCORDANCE HEREWITH, THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE DELIVERY OF PHYSICAL BOND CERTIFICATES SHALL BE DEEMED INAPPLICABLE OR BE OTHERWISE SO CONSTRUED AS TO GIVE FULL EFFECT TO SUCH BOOK-ENTRY SYSTEM. IF THE PROVISIONS OF THE LETTER OF REPRESENTATION SHALL BE IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION AS SAID PROVISIONS RELATE TO DTC, THE PROVISIONS OF THE LETTER OF REPRESENTATION SHALL CONTROL.

Section 4.6. Mutilated, Lost, Stolen, or Destroyed Bonds.

(a) In the event any Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen, or destroyed, the County may execute, and upon the request of an Authorized Officer of the County the Registration Agent shall authenticate and deliver, a new Bond of like maturity, interest rate, and principal amount, and bearing the same number (but with appropriate designation indicating that such new Bond is a replacement Bond) as the mutilated, destroyed, lost, or stolen Bond, in exchange for the mutilated Bond or in substitution for the Bond so destroyed, lost, or stolen. In every case of exchange or substitution, the Bondholder shall furnish to the County and the Registration Agent: (1) such security or indemnity as may be required by them to save each of them harmless from all risks, however remote; and, (2) evidence to their satisfaction of the mutilation, destruction, loss, or theft of the subject Bond and the ownership thereof. Upon the issuance of any Bond upon such exchange or substitution, the County and the Registration Agent may require the Owner thereof to pay a sum sufficient to defray any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and any other expenses, including printing costs and counsel fees, of the County and the Registration Agent. In the event any Bond which has matured or is about to mature shall become mutilated or be destroyed, lost, or stolen, the County may, instead of issuing a Bond in exchange or

substitution therefore, pay or authorize the payment of the same (without surrender thereof except in the case of a mutilated Bond) if the Owner thereof shall pay all costs and expenses, including attorneys fees, incurred by the County and the Registration Agent in connection herewith, as well as a sum sufficient to defray any tax or other governmental charge that may be imposed in relation thereto and shall furnish to the County and the Registration Agent such security or indemnity as they may require to save them harmless and evidence to the satisfaction of the County and the Registration Agent the mutilation, destruction, loss, or theft of such Bond and of the ownership thereof.

- (b) Every Bond issued pursuant to the provisions of this section shall constitute an additional contractual obligation of the County (whether or not the destroyed, lost, or stolen Bond shall be found at any time to be enforceable) and shall be entitled to all the benefits of this Bond Resolution equally and proportionately with any and all other Bonds duly issued under this Bond Resolution.
- (c) All Bonds shall be held and owned upon the express condition that the provisions of this Section are exclusive, with respect to the replacement or payment of mutilated, destroyed, lost, or stolen Bonds, and, to the maximum extent legally permissible, shall preclude all other rights or remedies, notwithstanding any law or statute now existing or hereafter enacted to the contrary.

Section 4.7. Authentication.

The Registration Agent is hereby authorized to authenticate and deliver the Bonds to the Underwriter or as it may designate upon receipt by the County of the proceeds of the sale thereof, to authenticate and deliver Bonds in exchange for Bonds of the same principal amount delivered for transfer upon receipt of the Bond(s) to be transferred in proper form with proper documentation as hereinabove described. The Bonds shall not be valid for any purpose unless authenticated by the Registration Agent by the manual signature of an officer thereof on the certificate set forth herein on the Bond form.

Section 4.8. Qualification for DTC.

The Registration Agent is hereby authorized to take such actions as may be necessary from time to time to qualify and maintain the Bonds for deposit with DTC, including but not limited to, wire transfers of interest and principal payments with respect to the Bonds, utilization of electronic book entry data received from DTC in place of actual delivery of Bonds and provision of notices with respect to Bonds registered by the DTC (or any of its designees identified to the Registration Agent) by overnight delivery, courier service, telegram, telecopy or other similar means of communication. No such arrangements with DTC may adversely affect the interest of any of the Owners of the Bonds, provided, however, that the Registration Agent shall not be liable with respect to any such arrangements it may make pursuant to this section.

Section 4.09. Rating Agency. The Chairman and Auditor are authorized to enter into an agreement with a Rating Agency as may be required under the Purchase Agreement. Any terms or conditions of the Rating Agency shall be attached to this resolution and incorporated herein as if stated in full.

ARTICLE V REDEMPTION OF BONDS PRIOR TO MATURITY

Section 5.1 Redemption. The redemption provisions shall be set forth in the Certificate Purchase Agreement.

ARTICLE VI REGISTRATION AGENT

Section 6.1. Appointment and Acceptance of Duties.

(a) The County hereby authorizes the Auditor to appoint the Registration Agent with respect to the Bonds and authorizes and directs the Registration Agent to maintain Bond registration records with respect to the Bonds, to authenticate and deliver the Bonds as provided herein, either at original issuance, upon transfer, or as otherwise directed by the County, to effect transfers of the Bonds, to give all notices of redemption as required herein, to make all payments of principal and interest with respect to the Bonds as provided herein, to cancel and destroy Bonds which have been paid at maturity or upon earlier redemption or submitted for exchange or transfer, to furnish the County at least annually a certificate of destruction with respect to Bonds canceled and destroyed, and to furnish the County at least annually an audit confirmation of Bonds paid, Bonds Outstanding and payments made with respect to interest on the Bonds. The Chairman and the Auditor, or either of them is hereby authorized to execute and the Auditor is hereby authorized to attest such written agreement between the County and the Registration Agent as they shall deem necessary or proper with respect to the obligations, duties and rights of the Registration Agent. The payment of all reasonable fees and expenses of the Registration Agent for the discharge of its duties and obligations hereunder or under any such agreement is hereby authorized and directed.

Section 6.2. Permitted Acts and Functions.

The Registration Agent may become the Owner of any Bonds, with the same rights as it would have if it were not a Registration Agent. The Registration Agent may act as an underwriter or fiscal agent in connection with the sale of the Bonds or of any other securities offered or issued by the County.

Section 6.3. Resignation or Removal of the Registration Agent and Appointment of Successors.

- (a) The Registration Agent may at any time resign and be discharged of the duties and obligations created by the Bond Resolution by giving at least sixty (60) calendar days' written notice to the Auditor. The Registration Agent may be removed at any time by the Auditor, provided that such removal does not constitute a breach of any contractual agreement with any such Registration Agent, by filing written notice of such removal with such Registration Agent. Any successor Registration Agent shall be appointed by the Auditor and shall be a trust company or a bank having the powers of a trust company, having a combined capital, surplus, and undivided profits aggregating at least Forty Million Dollars (\$40,000,000), willing to accept the office of Registration Agent on reasonable and customary terms and authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by the Bond Resolution.
- (b) In the event of the resignation or removal of the Registration Agent, such Registration Agent shall pay over, assign and deliver any monies and securities held by it as Registration Agent, and all books and records and other properties held by it as Registration Agent, to its successor, or if there be no successor then appointed, to the Auditor until such successor be appointed.

Section 6.4. Merger or Consolidation of Registration Agent.

Any corporation or association into which the Registration Agent may be converted or merged, or with which it may be consolidated, or to which it may sell or transfer its trust business and assets as a whole, or substantially as a whole, or any corporation or association resulting from any such conversion, sale, merger, consolidation, or transfer to which it is a party shall be and become successor Registration Agent hereunder and shall be vested with all the trusts, powers, discretion, immunities, privileges, and other matters as was its predecessor, without the execution or filing of any instrument or any further act, deed, or conveyance on the part of any of the parties hereto, anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding. Upon any such conversion, merger, consolidation, sale or transfer, the Auditor shall have the right and option, upon notice to such converted, merged, consolidated or acquiring entity, to remove such entity and appoint a successor thereto pursuant to the procedures and requirements set forth in Section 6.3 hereof.

ARTICLE VII DEFEASANCE OF BONDS

Section 7.1. Defeasance of Bonds.

If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Bonds in any one or more of the following ways, to wit:

- (a) By paying or causing to be paid, by deposit of sufficient funds as and when required with the Registration Agent, the principal of and interest on such Bonds as and when the same become due and payable;
- (b) By depositing or causing to be deposited with any trust company or financial institution whose deposits are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or similar federal agency and which has trust powers ("an Agent"; which Agent may be the Registration Agent) in trust or escrow, on or before the date of maturity or redemption, sufficient money or Federal Obligations, as hereafter defined, the principal of and interest on which, when due and payable, will provide sufficient moneys to pay or redeem such Bonds and to pay premium, if any, and interest thereon when due until the maturity or redemption date (provided, if such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to maturity thereof, proper notice of such redemption shall have been given or adequate provision shall have been made for the giving of such notice);
- (c) By delivering such Bonds to the Registration Agent, for cancellation by it; and if the County shall also pay or cause to be paid all other sums payable hereunder by the County with respect to such Bonds, or make adequate provision therefore, and by resolution of the Governing Body instruct any such Escrow Agent to pay amounts when and as required to the Registration Agent for the payment of principal of and interest and redemption premiums, if any, on such Bonds when due, then and in that case the indebtedness evidenced by such Bonds shall be discharged and satisfied and all covenants, agreements and obligations of the County to the holders of such Bonds shall be fully discharged and satisfied and shall thereupon cease, terminate and become void.

If the County shall pay and discharge the indebtedness evidenced by any of the Bonds in the manner provided in either clause (a) or clause (b) above, then the registered owners thereof shall thereafter be entitled only to payment out of the money or Federal Obligations deposited as aforesaid.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, neither Federal Obligations nor moneys deposited with the Registration Agent pursuant to this Section nor principal or interest payments on any such Federal Obligations shall be withdrawn or used for any purpose other than, and shall be held in trust for, the payment of the principal and premium, if any, and interest on said Bonds; provided that any cash received from such principal or interest payments on such Federal Obligations deposited with the Registration Agent, (A) to the extent such cash will not be required at any time for such purpose, shall be paid over to the County as received by the Registration Agent and (B) to the extent such cash will be required for such purpose at a later date, shall, to the extent practicable, be reinvested in Federal Obligations maturing at times and in amounts sufficient to pay when due the principal and premium, if any, and interest to become due on said Bonds on or prior to such redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be, and interest earned from such reinvestments shall be paid over to the County, as received by the Registration Agent. For the purposes of this Section, Federal Obligations shall mean direct obligations of, or obligations, the principal of and interest on which are guaranteed by, the United States of America, or any agency thereof, obligations of any agency or instrumentality of the United States or any other obligations at the time of the purchase thereof are permitted investments under South Dakota Law for the purposes described in this Section, which Bonds or other obligations shall not be subject to redemption prior to their maturity other than at the option of the registered owner thereof.

ARTICLE VIII SALE OF BONDS AND DEPOSIT OF PROCEEDS

Section 8.1. Sale of Bonds.

The Bonds shall be sold to the Underwriter at a price as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement less any Original Issue Discount on the Bonds plus accrued interest. The Chairman and the Auditor, or either of them, in consultation with the Underwriter, are authorized to make such changes in the structuring of the terms and sale of the Bonds, including the name, as they shall deem necessary to maximize the savings from the refunding of the Refunded Bonds. In this regard, they, or either of them, in consultation with the Underwriter, are authorized to cause to be sold an aggregate principal amount of the Bonds less than that authorized herein, cause fewer than all the Refunded Bonds to be refunded, to sell any or all of the Bonds as term Bonds with annual mandatory redemption requirements which will produce substantially the same annual principal reductions as authorized herein, to change the dated date of the Bonds, and to adjust principal and interest payment dates and redemption dates of the Bonds. The form of the Bond set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto shall be conformed to reflect any changes, if any, as hereinbefore mentioned. The Chairman and the Auditor, or either of them, are hereby authorized to execute and the Auditor is authorized to attest the Purchase Agreement with the Underwriter providing for the purchase and sale of the Bonds. The Purchase Agreement shall be in form and content acceptable to the Chairman and Auditor, the execution thereof by either of them to constitute conclusive evidence thereof, and approved as to form and legality by the County's attorney; provided the Purchase Agreement effects the sale of the Bonds in accordance with the provisions of this Resolution, and is not inconsistent with the terms hereof. The Chairman and the Auditor, are authorized to cause the Bonds to be authenticated and delivered by the Registration Agent to the Underwriter and to execute, publish, and deliver all certificates and documents, including the Official Statement, and closing certificates and documents, as they shall deem necessary in connection with the sale and delivery of the Bonds.

Section 8.2. Official Statement.

The Chairman, Auditor, and the Underwriter are hereby authorized and directed to provide for the preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement describing the Bonds in the form of the Preliminary Official Statement attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof (the "Preliminary Official Statement"). After the Bonds have been sold, the Chairman and Auditor shall make such completions, omissions, insertions and changes in the Preliminary Official Statement not inconsistent with this resolution as are necessary or desirable to complete it as a final Official Statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12(e)(3) of the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Chairman and Auditor shall arrange for the delivery to the Underwriter of a reasonable number of copies of the Official Statement within seven business days after the Bonds have been sold for delivery by the Underwriter to each potential investor requesting a copy of the Official Statement.

The Chairman and Auditor are authorized, on behalf of the County, to deem the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement in final form, each to be final as of its date within the meaning of Rule 15c2-12(b)(1), except for the omission in the Preliminary Official Statement of certain pricing and other information allowed to be omitted pursuant to such Rule 15c2-12(b)(1). The distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement and the Official Statement in final form shall be conclusive evidence that each has been deemed in final form as of its date by the County except for the omission in the Preliminary Official Statement of such pricing and other information.

Section 8.3. Disposition of Bond Proceeds.

The proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be disbursed as follows:



- (a) An amount representing accrued interest on the Bonds from the dated date to the closing date shall be deposited to the appropriate fund of the County to be used to pay interest on the Bonds on the first interest payment date following delivery of the Bonds.
- (b) An amount representing accrued interest and principal on the Series 2002 Bonds shall be deposited with the Series 2002 Bond Registrar and Paying Agent to be used to refund the Series 2002 Bonds.
- (c) The remaining proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be used to pay the costs of issuance and sale of the Bonds including necessary legal, accounting and fiscal expenses, printing, engraving, advertising and similar expenses, administrative and clerical costs, rating agency fees, Registration Agent fees, and other necessary miscellaneous expenses incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. Any funds remaining after payment of said expenses shall be used to pay interest on the Bonds on the first interest payment date following delivery of the Bonds.

Section 8.4. Tax Matters.

- (a) The County covenants and agrees with the registered owners from time to time of the Bonds that it will not take or permit to be taken by any of its officers, employees or agents any action which would cause the interest on the Bonds to become includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code and applicable Treasury Regulations (the "Regulations"), and covenants to take any and all actions within its powers to ensure that the basic interest on the Bonds will not become includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code and the Regulations.
- (b) The Chairman and the Auditor, being the officers of the County charged with the responsibility for issuing the Bonds pursuant to this Resolution are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the Underwriter thereof a certificate in accordance with the provisions of Section 148 of the Code, and Section 1.148-2(b) of the Regulations, stating that on the basis of facts, estimates and circumstances in existence on the date of issue and delivery of the Bonds, it is reasonably expected that the proceeds of the Bonds will be used in a manner that would not cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code and the Regulations.
- (c) The County further certifies and covenants as follows with respect to the requirements of Section 148 of the Code that the County reasonably expects, as of the Bond Date, that the aggregate face amount of all tax exempt bonds (other than private activity bonds) issued by it and all subordinate entities during the calendar year of 2009 will not exceed \$10,000,000.
- (d) The County shall file with the Secretary of the Treasury a statement concerning the Bonds containing the information required by Section 149(e) of the Code.
- (e) Pursuant to Section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Code, the County hereby designates the Bonds as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code. The County hereby represents that it does not anticipate that obligations bearing interest not includable in gross income for purposes of federal income taxation under Section 103 of the Code (including refunding obligations as provided in Section 265 (b) (3) of the Code and including "qualified 501 (c) (3) bonds" but excluding other "private activity Bonds," as defined in Sections 141(a) and 145(a) of the Code) will be issued by or on behalf of the County and all "subordinate entities" of the County in 2009 in an amount greater than \$10,000,000.

ARTICLE IX
NOTICE OF REFUNDING

Section 9.1. Notice of Refunding.

Prior to the issuance of the Bonds, notice of the County's intention to refund the Refunded Bonds shall be given, at the direction of the Auditor, by the Series 2002 Bond Registrar and Paying Agent, via first-class mail to the respective Registered Owners of the Refunded Bonds or any other manner as is required by DTC. Such notice shall be in substantially the form as provided in Exhibit B attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

ARTICLE X MISCELLANEOUS

Section 10.1. Failure to Present Bonds.

- (a) Subject to the provisions of Section 4.7 hereof, in the event any Bond shall not be presented for payment when the principal or redemption price hereof becomes due, either at maturity or at the date fixed for prior redemption thereof or otherwise, and in the event monies sufficient to pay such Bond shall be held by the Registration Agent for the benefit of the Owner thereof, all liability of the County to such Owner for the payment of such Bond shall forthwith cease, determine, and be completely discharged. Whereupon, the Registration Agent shall hold such monies, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the Owner of such Bond who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such monies for any claim under the Resolution or on, or with respect to, said Bond.
- (b) If any Bond shall not be presented for payment within a period of five years following the date when such Bond becomes due, whether by maturity or otherwise, the Registration Agent shall, subject to the provisions of any applicable escheat or other similar law, pay to the County any monies then held by the Registration Agent for the payment of such Bond and such Bond shall (subject to the defense of any applicable statute of limitation) thereafter constitute an unsecured obligation of the County.

Section 10.2. Payments Due on Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays.

In any case where the date of maturity or interest on or principal of any Bond, or the date fixed for redemption of any Bond, shall be a Saturday or Sunday or shall be, at the place designated for payment, a legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions similar to the Registration Agent are authorized by law to close, then the payment of the interest on, or the principal, or the redemption price of, such Bond need not be made on such date but must be made on the next succeeding day not a Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday or a day upon which banking institutions similar to the Registration Agent are authorized by law to close, with the same force and effect as if made on the date of maturity or the date fixed for redemption, and no interest shall accrue for the period after such date.

Section 10.3. Miscellaneous Acts.

The appropriate officers of the County are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to do any and all such acts and things, and to execute, acknowledge, deliver, and, if applicable file or record, or cause to be filed or recorded, in any appropriate public offices, all such documents, instruments, and certifications, in addition to those acts, things, documents, instruments, and certifications hereinbefore authorized and approved, as may, in their discretion, be necessary or desirable to implement or comply with the intent of the Bond Resolution, or any of the documents herein authorized and approved, or for the authorization, issuance, and delivery by the County of the Bonds.

Section 10.4. Amendment.

The School Board is hereby authorized to make such amendments to the Bond Resolution as will not impair the rights of the Bondholders.

Section 10.5. No Recourse Under Bond Resolution or on Bonds.

All stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County contained in the Initial Resolutions or the Resolution shall be deemed to be the stipulations, promises, agreements, and obligations of the County and not of any officer, director, or employee of the County in his or her individual capacity, and no recourse shall be had for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds or for any claim based thereon or on the Initial Resolution or the Resolution against any officer, director, or employee of the County or against any official or individual executing the Bonds.

Section 10.6. Partial Invalidity.

If any one or more of the provisions of the Bond Resolution, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, by final decree of any court of lawful jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, but the Bond Resolution, and the exhibits and attachments thereto, shall be construed the same as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, or therein, as the case may be.

Section 10.7. Continuing Disclosure.

The County hereby covenants and agrees that it will provide financial information upon request and material event notices as required by Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Commission for the Bonds. The Chairman is authorized to execute at the Closing of the sale of the Bonds, an agreement for the benefit of and enforceable by the owners of the Bonds specifying the details of the financial information and material event notices to be provided and its obligations relating thereto. Failure of the County to comply with the undertaking herein described and to be detailed in said closing agreement, shall not be a default hereunder, but any such failure shall entitle the owner or owners of any of the Bonds to take such actions and to initiate such proceedings as shall be necessary and appropriate to cause the County to comply with its undertaking as set forth herein and in said agreement, including the remedies of mandamus and specific performance.

Section 10.8. Conflicting Resolutions Repealed.

All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 10.9. Effective Date.

This Bond Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption, the welfare of the County requiring it.

MAXIMUM WEIGHT LIMITATION ON BRIDGES:

WHEREAS, SDCL 32-22-50 authorizes any peace officer having reason to believe that the weight of a vehicle and load is unlawful is authorized to weigh the same.

WHEREAS, County Government is increasingly unable to meet its statutory responsibilities to provide for law enforcement, human services, and the maintenance of county road infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, this inability to continue to fund these important services is directly related to a lack of financial resources caused by the property tax limitation statutes, outdated fee allowances currently in state law, and the absence of a funding stream that keeps pace with economic growth and inflation, and

WHEREAS, the board of county commissioners may levy a tax not to exceed one dollar per thousand dollars of taxable valuation for the capital outlay fund for assets as defined by this section, its obligations under a resolution, or a lease-purchase agreement, and

WHEREAS, the capital outlay fund of the county is a fund provided by law to meet expenditures which result in the acquisition or lease of or additions to real property, plant, or equipment, and

WHEREAS, any expenditure from the fund shall be for land, existing facilities, improvement of grounds, construction of facilities, additions to facilities, remodeling of facilities, or for the purchase or lease of equipment, and

WHEREAS, an expenditure from the fund may also be used for installment or lease-purchase payment for the purchase of real property, plant, or equipment, which have a contracted terminal date not exceeding twenty years from the date of the installment contract, and

WHEREAS, the county may cooperate in a joint undertaking for any purpose provided in this section with any other county, municipality, or school district, and

WHEREAS, the levy authorized by this section is in addition to the levies authorized in §§ 7-25-1 and 10-12-21. Any tax imposed pursuant to this section is exempt from the tax limitations imposed on a county by chapter 10-13, and

WHEREAS, section 10-13-35 does not apply to school districts or any tax imposed by a county pursuant to section 1 of this Act, and

WHEREAS, for taxes payable in 1997, and each year thereafter, the total amount of revenue payable from taxes on real property within a taxing district, excluding the levy pursuant to § 10-13-36, may increase no more than the lesser of three percent or the index factor, as defined in § 10-13-38, over the amount of revenue payable from taxes on real property in the preceding year, excluding the amount of taxes levied pursuant to § 10-13-36, and

WHEREAS, after applying the index factor, a taxing district may increase the revenue payable from taxes on real property above the limitations provided by this section by the percentage increase of value resulting from any improvements or change in use of real property, annexation, minor boundary changes, and any adjustments in taxation of property separately classified and subject to statutory adjustments and reductions under chapters 10-4, 10-6, 10-6A, and 10-6B, except § 10-6-31.4, only if assessed the same as property of equal value, and

WHEREAS, a taxing district may increase the revenue it receives from taxes on real property above the limit provided by this section for taxes levied to pay the principal, interest, and redemption charges on any bonds issued after January 1, 1997, which are subject to referendum, scheduled payment increases on bonds and for a levy directed by the order of a court for the purpose of paying a judgment against such taxing district, and

WHEREAS, any taxing district created after the effective date of this section is exempt from the limitation provided by this section for a period of two years immediately following its creation,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brown County Commission supports legislation that will permit counties to impose a capital outlay tax for construction and equipment purposes and exempt counties from certain tax limitations on property.

The credit card account shall only be used for the purchase of meeting registration, motel room guarantees, or other purchases that cannot be accomplished by the issuance of a purchase order and billed directly to the County to be processed in the normal warrant process, unless it is more economically advantageous to pay by credit card. Cards may be used to pay for pre-authorized purchases through the Internet, if it is the only means of payment accepted by the vendor. All purchases in excess of \$2,500.00 must be pre-approved by the County Commission.

The card may not be used to pay for meals that qualify for reimbursement through per diem or for any item, which does not directly benefit the County.

The credit card accounts shall be administered by the designated official at all times, and the designated official may assign sub-administrators for certain departments to oversee the usage, limits, and processing for that department. In all cases where a credit card is used by any county employee original receipts, invoices or other authentic documentation stating what the card was used for shall be submitted to the designated administrator or sub-administrator. The designed person shall immediately verify the purchase was necessary and to the benefit of the County and submit the invoice to the Auditor's Office

with appropriate account coding information. Charges submitted to the Auditor's Office for payment without the proper documentation will not be processed and may become the responsibility of the employee through garnishment. Personal use of the credit card is strictly prohibited. Misuse of credit card accounts or repeated failure to provide proper documentation will be the responsibility of the employee and will be considered grounds for disciplinary action up to and including termination and any restitution.

Any perks, credits or items of value earned because of the use of said cards shall only be used for the benefit of the County and not for that of any employee.
