Regarding Postal Service-Aberdeen, SD, AMP Consolidation Plan/Study

WHEREAS, the US Postal Service has given notice to Aberdeen, SD that it is considering the consolidation of the mail processing of the 574 zip code mail, thus sending all of the Aberdeen mail to the Dakota Central processing center in Huron, SD; and

WHEREAS, The Brown County Commission has determined the impact of delayed delivery of mail to Aberdeen and from Aberdeen, and has determined that the Postal Service plan (or study) will negatively affect several of the economic engines of Aberdeen and Northeast and North Central South Dakota, including companies who plan to grown their use of first class mail, and government entities that count on very timely mail delivery and their constituencies; and

WHEREAS, the US Postal Service conducted a public hearing in Aberdeen, SD on May 9, 2011, before which Aberdeen knew very little about what was contemplated, studied or planned, but at which time Aberdeen learned a bit more about what the Postal Service is considering, reinforcing the determination that the plan to consolidate will definitely affect negatively the economy of NE South Dakota, as well as service various folks in the region depend on for health care and other such uses; and

WHEREAS, at such public hearing it was clear that the US Postal Service does not understand that Aberdeen is a growing economy, and regional trade center for a considerable range of geography in North and South Dakota, the Dakotas District of the US Postal Service; and

WHEREAS, it is clear that the US Postal Service plan or study would significantly interrupt business operations of several significant businesses and institutions in the region, and carve up the regional trade territory of Aberdeen; and

WHEREAS, the Brown County Commission agrees that the US Postal Service plan or study needs to be rethought and mail processing brought to Aberdeen, or additional equipment brought to Aberdeen to assist with the problem solving of the US Postal Service in a more productive and constructive manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Brown County Commission, that it invite the US Postal Service to think differently about Aberdeen, it's role in the economy, and it's role in mail processing in NE and North Central South Dakota; and that it go on record opposed to any move that transfers the mail processing of the mail of the 574 zip code to Dakota Central.

EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT FOR LIDAR PROJECT:

Commissioner Fischbach offered the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION #42-11

WHEREAS, SD Codified Law, Chapter 5-18A-8; Brown County seeks to enter into a contract for services without competition as the requested services are of a unique and urgent nature that require an expedited timeline. Such services do not allow for the formal bid or proposal letting process outlined in SD Chapter 5-18A, and

WHEREAS, Brown County needs to acquire LiDAR-derived elevation data for the western 40% of the county (see attached map) in order to obtain 100% LiDAR coverage of the county. The LiDAR data and derivative products will be used to create a water management plan for the county which will be utilized

to study and mitigate flooding that has and continues to take place within the county and surrounding region. Acquisition of the LiDAR is the first step in preparing the plan and must occur in FY2011 so that flood mitigation analysis can occur before spring 2012, and

WHEREAS, A fall 2011 LiDAR collection was originally planned and was deemed to be the ideal time for such. Funding sources had been acquired and plans set for a fall collection. One of the funding sources included a 50% matching grant from SDEM mitigation funds. The original understanding of Brown County officials was that a contract authorizing the services had to be signed by July 1, 2011 but the deliverables could arrive later. On May 10, 2011 the Brown County GIS office learned that the SDEM grant funds would only be available if actual LiDAR products were delivered by September 1, 2011. This requirement rules out a fall 2011 collection and, instead, requires an expedited spring 2011 collection, and

WHEREAS, A spring 2011 collection requires the immediate contracting of a vendor as emerging vegetation has a degrading effect on the data being collected. Time is of the essence and, waiting even a few extra days to complete a formal bid letting process will greatly compromise the quality of the end product. It is therefore determined that an emergency procurement of such is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Brown County Commission select Fugro Horizons, of Rapid City, SD as the vendor for the services and products to be obtained. As the vendor that was previously contracted by the USCOE to collect the eastern 60% of Brown County, it is the opinion of Brown County officials as well as our funding partners and additional local experts in the field of LiDAR collection that Fugro Horizons is the only firm capable of meeting all three of the project requirements including; 1) collection of the raw LiDAR data within an expedited timeframe (before June 1, 2011), 2) integration of the previously-collected USCOE LiDAR data with the newly-collected data as to deliver a single seamless dataset and 3) delivery of data products before September 1, 2011. This firm also has the professional skill set and experience necessary to adequately collect this data.

Further, Fugro Horizons, the selected vendor, has provided a proposal for services that falls within a price range previously estimated using the USCOE contract as an example. Thus, Brown County and its funding partners are ensured that the price for the services and deliverables will be within the project budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Brown County Commission Chairman is hereby authorized to sign agreement with Furgo Horizons for completion of the LIDAR Project.

- 3. All other licenses shall be issued and renewed at the maximum fee allowed by SDCL 35-4-2 as amended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Brown County shall approve a maximum of eight (8) on-sale liquor dealer licenses for the ensuing year.

WHEREAS, the Brown County Board of County Commissioners has set the number and fee for on-sale liquor dealer licenses by resolution; and

WHEREAS, Brown County currently has issued 7 on-sale liquor licenses, making 1 available for issuance January 1, 2012; and

WHEREAS the Brown County Board of Commissioners wishes to make the license available to the public in a fair and impartial manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Brown County Commission makes the following rules applicable to the issuance of new on-sale liquor dealer licenses:

Applicants may apply for the existing on-sale liquor dealer license beginning on the date of this resolution by submitting an application packet to the Brown County Auditor. Such application packet shall include the following:

- Uniform Alcoholic Beverage Application. This must be completed fully and according to its instructions, and bear the necessary original signatures. Photocopies will not be accepted.
- Application Fee. Certified check, cashier's check, or bank draft in the amount of \$4,000.00, which guarantees that the applicant will consummate the purchase of the on-sale liquor dealer license if the applicant is successful in the lottery for such license as set forth below.
- i. If the applicant fails or refuses to consummate the purchase of the on-sale liquor dealer license, the applicant shall forfeit and the County shall be entitled to retain the application fee as liquidated damages. Any applicant who fails or refuses to consummate the purchase according to the terms of this resolution shall be disqualified from applying for any alcoholic beverage license for a period of one year.
- ii. In the event that applicant whose name is drawn in the lottery shall not be able to meet the licensing standards set out by SDCL Ch. 35-2, the applicant shall forfeit and the County shall be entitled to retain the application fee as liquidated damages.
- iii. The winner of the lottery shall have the application fee credited toward the issuance fee for the on-sale liquor dealer license.
- iv. Those unsuccessful in the lottery shall have their application fee refunded immediately.
- **Deadline**. All applications for the on-sale liquor dealer license shall be delivered to the office of the Brown County Auditor not later than 5:00 p.m. on October 31, 2011.
- Lottery. The names of those applicants who have submitted a valid application for the on-sale liquor dealer license shall be drawn at random in an open meeting of the County Commission on

November 15, 2011. The application of the person, whose name is drawn will be accepted by the County Commission and that applicant's application shall be set for hearing in accordance with SDCL Ch. 35-

In the event the applicant refuses to consummate the purchase of the on-sale liquor dealer license or fails to meet the licensing standards set out by SDCL Ch. 35-2, a subsequent lottery shall be held according to the terms of this Resolution.

In the event that no valid applications are received by the Brown County Auditor by 5:00 p.m. on October 31, 2011, then the on-sale liquor dealer license shall become available on a first-come, first-served basis, subject to the statutory licensing terms regarding notice, hearing, and all license requirements. For purposes of this resolution, "first-come first-served" shall mean that the first fully and accurately completed application for the on-sale liquor dealer license which is submitted to the office of the Brown County Auditor with the issuance fee of \$40,000.00 in good funds shall be entitled to have their application noticed and heard in accordance with the alcoholic beverage licensing statutes.

In the event the first-come first-served applicant is not able to meet the licensing standards set out by SDCL Ch. 35-2, the applicant who next submits a fully and accurately completed application together with the issuance fee in good funds shall be next considered.

RESOLUTION NO. 75-11

RESOLUTION GIVING APPROVAL TO THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF TAX INCREMENTAL REVENUE BONDS FOR TAX INCREMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$8,995,000 PLUS COSTS OF ISSUANCE TO FINANCE TAX INCREMENT PROJECT COSTS, CAPITALIZED INTEREST AND CLOSING COSTS AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A DEVELOPER'S AGREEMENT AND RELATED DOCUMENTS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of the County of Brown as follows:

1. <u>Declaration of Necessity.</u> The County of Brown (the "County") find and declares a necessity to issue tax increment revenue bonds in connection with Tax Increment District Number One and use the proceeds therewith to pay for project costs as listed in the tax increment project plan (the

- "Project") which Project has been approved and copies of plans are on file with the Auditor open to public inspection.
- 2. <u>Authority.</u> The County is authorized to issue its tax increment revenue bonds to finance project costs pursuant to Section 11-9-33 of the South Dakota Codified Laws. Pursuant to Chapter 11-9 of the South Dakota Codified Laws (the "Act") the County proposes to issue tax incremental revenue bonds (as herein authorized, the Tax Incremental Revenue Bonds, or the "Bonds") to finance a portion of the Project costs. The County is authorized by the Act to pledge a special fund into which the County will deposit the tax increment (as defined by the Act).
- 3. Pledge of State of South Dakota. Pursuant to SDCL 11-9-39.1, the state of South Dakota does pledge to and agree with the holders of any obligations issued under 11-9 that the state will not alter the rights vested in the bond holders until such bonds, together with the interest thereon, with interest on any unpaid installments of interest, and all costs and expenses in connection with any action or proceeding by or on behalf of such holders, are fully met and discharged.
- 4. <u>Authorization to issue the Bonds</u>. The County does hereby authorize the issuance of the tax increment revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$8,955,000 plus costs of issuance (the "Bonds").
- 5. <u>No Election Required</u>. The Bonds may be issued by the County without an election pursuant to SDCL §11-9-34.
- 6. <u>Form of Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be prepared in substantially the form as to be filed with the Auditor and open to public inspection.
 - 6.1. Terms of Bonds. The County Commission hereby authorizes the issuance and sale of the Bonds. The principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed any statutory or constitutional debt limitation and be in such amounts as will be retired with the Tax Increment District Number One revenues. The Bonds shall have maturities and interest rates as negotiated by the Chairman and Auditor, subject to the limitation of term as stated in the Act. The Bonds shall be prepared under the direction of the Auditor and shall be executed on behalf of the County by the facsimile or manual signatures of the Chairman and the Auditor and countersigned by the facsimile or manual signature of an attorney actually residing in the State of South Dakota and duly licensed to practice therein.
- 7. Registration. The County hereby appoints its Auditor as paying agent, registrar and transfer agent (the "Registrar") for the Bonds. The County reserves the right to appoint a financial institution as Registrar upon thirty (30) days' notice. The effect of registration and the rights and duties of the County and the Registrar with respect thereto shall be as follows:
 - 7.1.1. Register. The Registrar shall keep at its office a register (the "Register") in which the Registrar shall provide for the registration of ownership of the Bonds and the registration of transfers and exchanges of the Bonds entitled to be registered, transferred or exchanged.
 - 7.1.2. Transfer of Bonds. When a Bond is surrendered for transfer it shall be duly endorsed by the registered owner thereof or accompanied by a written instrument of transfer in form satisfactory to the Registrar; duly executed by the registered owner thereof or by an attorney duly authorized by the registered owner thereof. If the Bond is properly surrendered as provided above, the Registrar shall authenticate and deliver, in the name of the designated transferee, a new Bond of a like aggregate principal amount and maturity. The Registrar may, however, close the books for registration of any transfer after the fifteenth day of the month preceding each interest payment date and until such interest payment date.

- 7.1.3. Exchange of Bonds. Whenever a Bond is surrendered by the registered owner for exchange the Registrar shall authenticate and deliver the new Bond of a like aggregate principal amount and maturity, as required by the registered owner or the owner's attorney in writing.
- 7.1.4. <u>Cancellation</u>. All Bonds surrendered upon any transfer or exchange shall be promptly canceled by the Registrar and thereafter disposed of as directed by the County.
- 7.1.5. Improper or Unauthorized Transfer. When any Bond is presented the Registrar may refuse to transfer the same until satisfied that the endorsement on such Bond or separate instrument of transfer is valid and genuine and that the requested transfer is legally authorized. The Registrar shall incur no liability for the refusal, in good faith, to make transfer which, in their judgment, are deemed improper or unauthorized.
- 7.1.6. Persons Deemed Owners. The County, Paying Agent and Registrar may treat the person whose name on any Bond is at any time registered in the Register as the absolute owner of such Bond, whether such Bond shall be overdue or not, for the purpose of receiving payment of or on account of, the principal of and interest on such Bond and for all other purposes, and all such payments so made to any such registered owner or upon the owner's order shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.
- 7.1.7. <u>Taxes, Fees and Charges</u>. For every transfer or exchange of Bond, the Registrar may impose a charge upon the owner thereof sufficient to reimburse the Registrar for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such transfer or exchange.
- 7.1.8. Mutilated, Lost, Stolen or Destroyed Bonds. In case any Bond shall become mutilated or be destroyed, stolen or lost, the Registrar shall deliver a new Bond of like amount, number, maturity date and tenor in exchange and substitution for and upon cancellation of any such mutilated Bond or in lieu of and in substitution for any such Bond destroyed, stolen or lost, upon the payment of the reasonable expenses and charges of the Registrar in connection therewith; and, in the case of a Bond destroyed, stolen or lost, upon filing with the Registrar of evidence satisfactory that such Bond was destroyed, stolen or lost, and of the ownership thereof, and upon furnishing to the Registrar of an appropriate bond or indemnity in form, substance and amount satisfactory to the Registrar, in which the County and the Registrar shall be named as obligees. All Bonds so surrendered to the Registrar shall be canceled by him and evidence of such cancellation shall be given to the County. If the mutilated, destroyed, stolen or lost certificate has already matured or has been called for redemption in accordance with its terms it shall not be necessary to issue a new Bond prior to payment.
- 8. <u>Security Provisions; Funds and Accounts and Other Covenants and Determinations.</u>
 - 8.1. Pledge Tax Increments. Pursuant to the Act, the County shall receive Tax Increments as defined by the Act. All Tax Increments shall be placed in the Tax Incremental Revenue Bond Fund Number One ("Bond Fund"). The Tax Increment Revenues are irrevocably pledged and appropriated to, and shall be deposited to the Bond Fund. For purposes of this Resolution, "Outstanding Bonds" shall mean these Bonds and any parity lien bonds herebefore or hereafter issued pursuant to this Resolution. The Bond Fund shall be used and

applied only in the manner and order hereinafter set forth. The holders of the Outstanding Bonds shall have a lien against the Bond Fund for payment of the principal and interest and may either at law or in equity protect and enforce the lien. THE COUNTY DOES NOT PLEDGE ITS PROPERTY, GENERAL CREDIT OR TAXING POWER, OTHER THAN TAX INCREMENT REVENUES, FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE TAX INCREMENT REVENUE BONDS. THE SOLE SOURCE OF PAYMENT OF THE BONDS IS THE TAX INCREMENT REVENUES.

- 8.2. <u>Bond Fund</u>. The Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to establish and shall maintain a special account, the Bond Fund, as a separate and special fund in the financial records of the County until all Bonds issued and made payable therefrom, and interest due thereon, have been duly paid or discharged. All collections of the Tax Increments, as hereinafter defined, shall be credited, as received, to the Bond Fund. Within the Bond Fund are various separate accounts to be maintained by the County.
 - 8.2.1. Project Account. There is hereby created and established as an account of the Bond Fund, a "Project Account". There shall be credited to the Project Account the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds remaining after payment of the expenses of issuing the Bonds. All moneys credited to the Project Account shall be applied solely to the payment or reimbursement of the costs of the Project. For the purposes of this Resolution, "costs of the Project" shall include costs of acquiring, construction, and installing the Project including cost of labor, services, materials and supplies, financial, architectural, engineering, legal, accounting and other professional expenses relating to the Project, the costs of acquisition of properties, grants, rights, easements, or other interest in properties, insurance premiums, and the costs of publishing, posting or mailing notices in connection with the Project. All sums derived from the investment of moneys in the Project Account shall remain in and become part of such account. Upon completion of the Project and when all costs of the Project have been paid, any balance remaining in the Project Account shall be credited to the Principal and Interest Account hereinafter established.
 - 8.2.2. Principal and Interest Account. There is hereby created and established as an account of the Bond Fund, a "Principal and Interest Account." Immediately upon delivery of the Bonds, there shall be credited to the Principal and Interest Account the amount of any accrued interest received from the Purchaser. Periodically, as needed there shall be withdrawn from the Bond Fund and credited to the Principal and Interest Account an amount which will equal at least the next principal and interest payment. In all events there shall be credited to the Principal and Interest Account amounts sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Outstanding Bonds as the same become due.
 - 8.2.3. <u>Subordinate Lien Bonds</u>. After making the above required payments, any remaining Tax Increment shall be used for the payment of the principal of and interest on any additional Tax Incremental revenue bonds having a lien which is subordinate to the lien of the Outstanding Bonds, and for a reserve fund as additional security for the payment of such subordinate lien bonds.
 - 8.2.4. <u>Deposit and Investment of Funds</u>. The Auditor shall cause all moneys pertaining to the Fund to be deposited as received with one or more banks which are duly qualified public depositories under the provisions of Chapter 4-6A, South Dakota Codified Laws, in a deposit account or accounts, which shall be maintained separate and apart from all other accounts of the County, so long as any of the

Bonds and the interest thereon shall remain unpaid. Any of such moneys not necessary for immediate use may be deposited with such depository banks in savings or time deposits. No moneys shall at any time be withdrawn from such deposit accounts except for the purposes of the Fund as authorized in this Resolution; except that moneys from time to time on hand in the Fund may at any time, in the discretion of this Council, be invested in securities permitted by the provisions of Section 4-5-6, South Dakota Codified Laws, maturing and bearing interest at the times and in the amounts estimated to be required to provide cash when needed for the purposes of the respective accounts. Income received from the deposit or investment of moneys shall be credited to the account from whose moneys the deposit was made or the investment was purchased, and handled and accounted for in the same manner as other moneys in that account.

- 8.3. <u>Defeasance</u>. When all the Bonds issued have been discharged as provided in this section, all pledges, covenants, and other rights granted by this resolution to the registered owners of the Bonds shall cease. The County may discharge its obligations with respect to any Bonds which are due on any date by providing to the Paying Agent on or before that date a sum sufficient for the payment thereof in full; or, if any Bond should not be paid when due, it may nevertheless be discharged by providing to the Paying Agent a sum sufficient for the payment thereof in full with interest accrued to the date of such deposit. The County may also discharge its liability with reference to all Bonds which are called for redemption on any date in accordance with their terms by depositing funds with the Paying Agent on or before that date in accordance with their terms by depositing funds with the Paying Agent on or before that date, in an amount equal to the principal, interest, and premium, if any, which are then due thereon, provided that notice of such redemption has been duly given. The County may also at any time discharge this issue of Bonds in its entirety, subject to the provisions of law now or hereafter authorizing and regulating such action, by depositing irrevocably in escrow, with a bank qualified by law as an escrow agent for this purpose, cash or United States government obligations which are authorized by law to be so deposited, bearing interest payable at such times and at such rates and maturing on such dates as shall be required to provide funds (without an reinvestment) sufficient to pay all principal, interest and premiums, if any, to become due on all Bonds on and before maturity, or, if a Bond has been duly called for redemption, on or before the designated redemption date.
- 9. <u>Tax-Exempt Bonds</u>. The County shall issue the bonds the interest of which shall not be included in gross income for federal income tax purposes.
- 10. <u>Certification of Proceedings</u>. The officers of the County are authorized and directed to prepare and furnish to the purchasers of the Bonds certified copies of all proceedings and records of the County relating to the authorization and issuance of the Bonds and such other affidavits and certificates as may reasonably be required to show the facts relating to the legality and marketability of the Bonds as such facts appear from the officer's books and records or are otherwise known to them. All such certified copies, certificates and affidavits, including any heretofore furnished, shall constitute representations of the County as to the correctness of the facts recited therein and the action stated therein to have been taken. The County does hereby declare its official intent to reimburse the capital expenditures made with respect to the Project with proceeds of the Bonds.
- 11. <u>Authorization of Developer's Agreement and Related Documents.</u> The officers of the County are authorized and directed to negotiate and execute such developer's agreement and related

documents as they deem necessary. All such documents shall be deemed ratified by the County upon execution by the Chairman and County Auditor.

- 12. Partial Invalidity. If any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, shall be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, by final decree of any court of lawful jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, or of any exhibit or attachment thereto, but this Resolution, and the exhibits and attachments thereto, shall be construed the same as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, or therein, as the case may be.
- 13. <u>Miscellaneous Acts</u>. The appropriate officers of the County are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to do any and all such acts and things, and to execute, acknowledge, deliver, and, if applicable file or record, or cause to be filed or recorded, in any appropriate public offices, all such documents, instruments, and certifications, in addition to those acts, things, documents, instruments, and certifications hereinbefore authorized and approved, as may, in their discretion, be necessary or desirable to implement or comply with the intent of this Resolution, or any of the documents herein authorized and approved, or for the authorization, issuance, and delivery by the County of the Bonds or execution of the Developer's Agreement and related documents.
